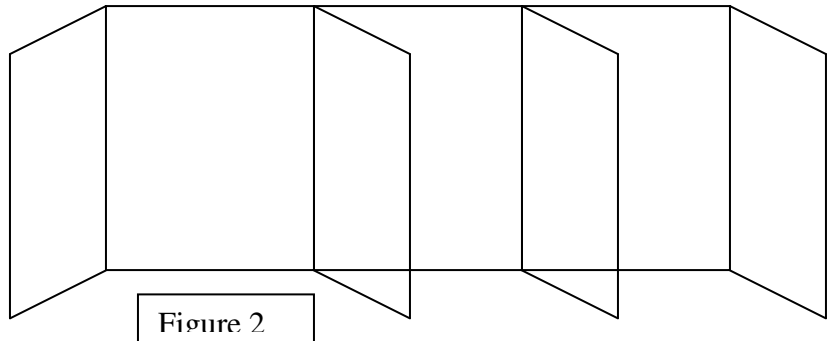
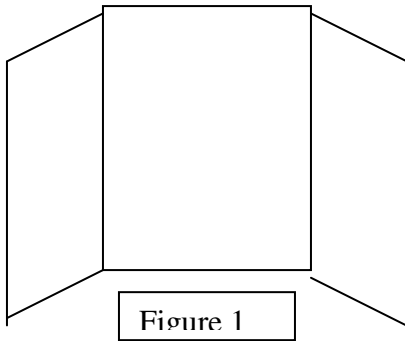


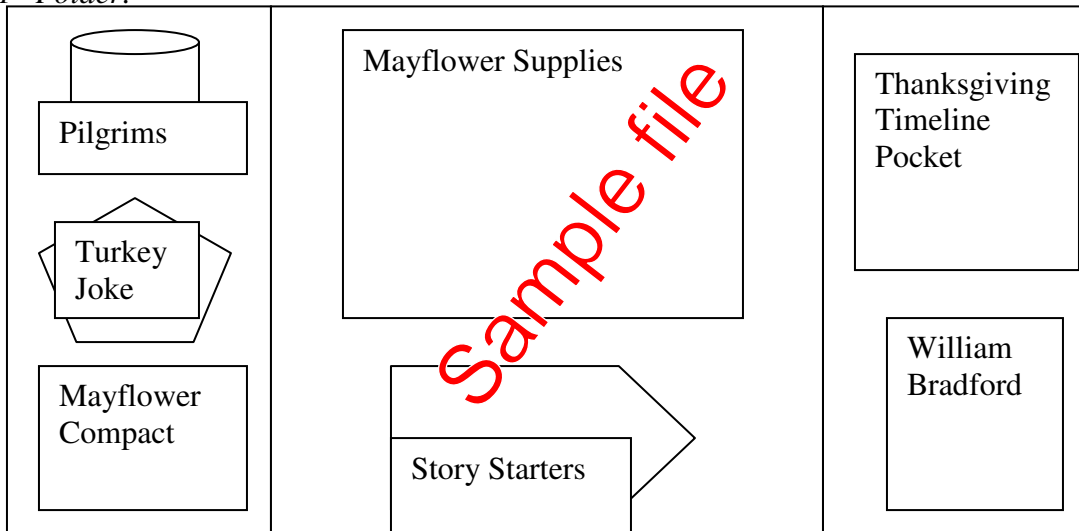
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You will need 3 folders of any color. Take each one and fold both sides toward the original middle fold, and make firm creases on these folds (Figure 1). Then glue (and staple if needed) the backs of the small flaps together (Figure 2).

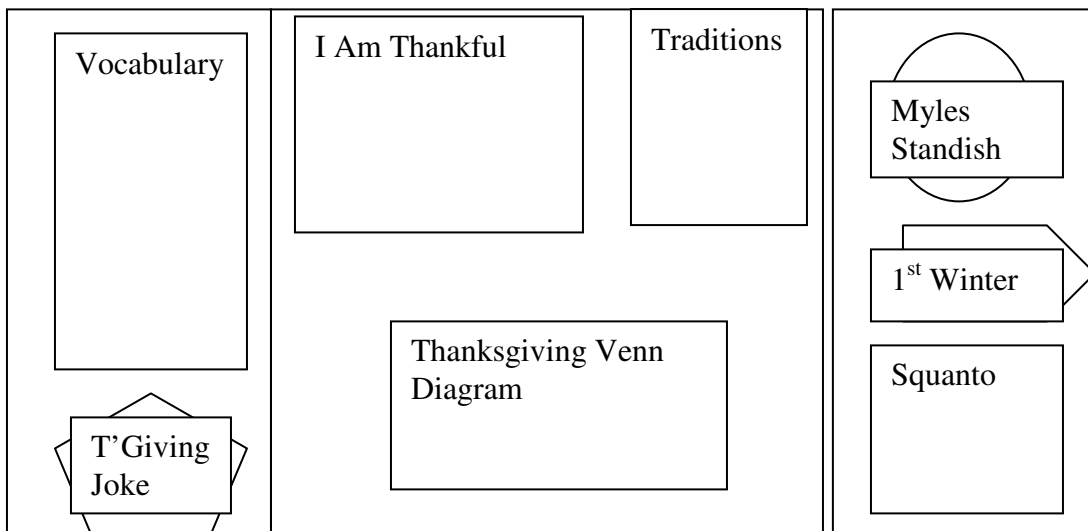


This is the “Layout” for your lapbook. The shapes are not exact on the layout, but you will get the idea of where each booklet should go inside your lapbook.

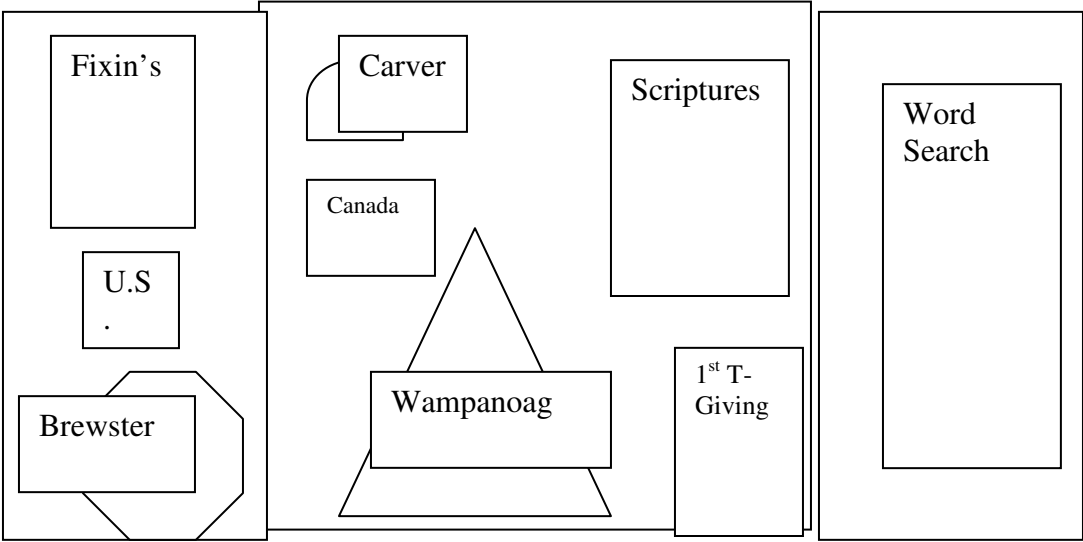

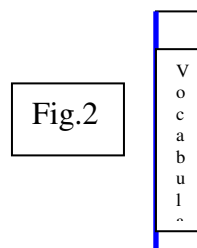
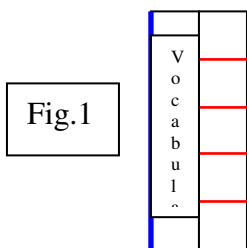
Thanksgiving Lapbook Assembly Guide

Inside of 1st Folder:

1. Who Were the Pilgrims Booklet: Cut out along outer black line edge, and fold along middle line, so that the title is on the front.
2. Turkey Joke Booklet: Cut out along outer black line edge, and fold along middle line, so that the title is on the front.
3. Mayflower Compact Booklet: Cut out along outer black line edge, and fold along middle line, so that the title is on the front.
4. Mayflower Supplies Booklet: Cut out along the outer black lines. Then, mount to a slightly larger piece of paper of a different color.
5. Thanksgiving Story Starters Booklet: Cut out along outer black line edges of all pages. Then, stack them so that the title/picture page is on top. You can secure them together in a number of ways. You can punch 2 holes on the left side, and tie a ribbon, or you can staple. You could also use metal brad fasteners.
6. Thanksgiving Timeline Pocket: Cut out along outer black line edges of each pumpkin and cornucopia shape. Also cut out the label. Place the shapes inside an envelope, and glue the label on the outside of the envelope. Then, secure the envelope to your lapbook.
7. William Bradford Booklet: Cut out along outer black line edge, and fold along center line, so that the title page is on the front.

Inside of 2nd Folder:

1. Thanksgiving Vocabulary Booklet: Fold along **middle** vertical bold blue line (Fig. 1). Then fold along two vertical black lines that are on each side of the blue line, so that the part with the red lines is on the inside. Then cut along red lines, which makes little "flaps". Your final thin booklet will look like Fig. 2.



2. Mayflower Joke Booklet: Cut out around the outer black line edges, and then fold in the middle, so that the title page is on the front.
3. I Am Thankful Booklet: Cut out around the outer black line edges of both pages. Stack the title/picture page on top, and punch 2 holes in the left side. Tie a ribbon through the holes to secure.
4. Our Family's Traditions Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges. Then, fold along the center line, so that the title is on the front.
5. Thanksgiving Venn Diagram Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges. Then, mount this page onto a slightly larger piece of paper of a different color.
6. Myles Standish Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges of the ovals, making sure to keep them connected. Then fold in the center, with the title page on the front.
7. First Winter Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges. Then, fold in half along the middle line, so that the title is on the front.
8. Who Was Squanto Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges. Then, fold along the blue lines, so that you fold each end toward the middle, and the title ends up on the front.

Inside 3rd Folder

1. Thanksgiving Fixin's Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges of each page. Then, stack them on top of each other, with the title page on top. Staple along the left side, or punch holes and tie ribbons.
2. What Day is Thanksgiving Celebrated Booklets (2): Cut out along the outer black line edges. Then, fold along the center lines, so that the title is on the front.
3. William Brewster Booklet: Cut out along the octagon shapes, and then fold in the center, so that the title is on the front.
4. John Carver Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges, and fold in the center, so that the title is on the front.
5. Scriptures About Giving Thanks Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges of each page, and then stack them so that the title page is on top. Punch holes in the left side, and tie ribbons to secure.
6. Wampanoag Booklet: Cut out the tee-pee shaped booklet pages. Stack them so that the title is on top. Punch a hole in the top of the stack, and tie a leather strip, raffia, or dark string through the hole to secure.
7. The First Thanksgiving Booklet: Cut out along the outer black line edges. Then, cut out the title text box. Fold the booklet accordion-style, so that the words are on the inside, and a blank is left on the back to attach to the lapbook folder. Glue the title on the front flap.
8. Thanksgiving Word Search: Cut out along the outer black line edges of the word search. Then glue this to a slightly larger piece of paper of a different color, so that there is a border around it. Fold the entire booklet in the middle, vertically. Then, secure it to your lapbook folder.
